- **Peer Warm Lines**—provide direct communication link and emotional support for patients, families and make referrals to providers and community services.
- **Prevention, Education and Outreach**—community meetings, trainings, events and educational forums
- **Peer-Run Programs**—support and capacity building for other community advocacy and peer services.

Snapshot: Dee's Place

Dee's Place is a Recovery Community Center located on 1212 North Wolfe St. in Baltimore, Maryland. It is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including holidays. There are at least 2 Peer Recovery Support Specialists available at all times. Program services include free acupuncture, individual and peer counseling, career services/ employment readiness programs, HIV

counseling and testing and referrals



to other needed services such as supportive housing, food, clothing and GED classes. They provide referrals to many levels of treatment – buprenorphine (suboxone), inpatient and mental health counseling. No appointments are necessary and they accept insured and uninsured clients. They host the Vehicles for Change Program which provides access to owning your own vehicle for working individuals. Free parking is available in the rear of the building. There are continuous 12-Step meetings held in Dee's Place. It is a warm and welcoming place. Stop in!

What is ARCO?

ARCO stands for the Association of Recovery Community Organizations. ARCO is a part of Faces & Voices of Recovery, an organization that encourages recovery communities to be organized and mobilized to address policies, practices and perceptions for people affected by alcohol and other drugs. Faces & Voices ARCO unites and supports the growing network of local, regional and statewide recovery community organizations (RCOs). ARCO links RCOs and their leaders with local and national allies and provides training and technical assistance to groups. ARCO helps build the unified voice of the organized recovery community.
