Re: FEMA Public Assistance Program

Maryland has received a Presidential declaration of disaster as a result of the severe storms in Maryland for the period of June 29 – July 8, 2012. The following areas have been determined to be adversely affected by the disaster: Baltimore City, Calvert, Charles, Kent, Montgomery, and Saint Mary's counties.

State and local governments as well as private non-profit organizations that provide certain services of governmental nature may file applications for FEMA's Public Assistance Program for supplemental financial assistance for debris removal, emergency protective measures, and permanent restoration of infrastructure.
