Data Reporting Flow Sheet for the Discharge of Patients with Substance Related Disorders

A. FOR PATIENTS IN LEVEL 1 TREATMENT (Outpatient or Opioid Treatment Program [OTP]):

1. Short term transfer to Level 2.1 (Intensive Outpatient Services), Level 2.5 (Partial Hospitalization Services), Level 3.7 (Medically Monitored Intensive Inpatient Services-Community-based), Level 3.7 WM (providers who also provide withdrawal management services), and 4.0 WM (Medically Managed Intensive Inpatient Services-Hospital-based) from Level 1.

Returning to Level 1 or OTP with an agency or OTP provider after higher level of care?

"Yes"->Leave authorization open. Do not discharge patient from Level 1 or OTP services.

"No"->Discharge patient from Level 1 or OTP.

2. Transfer to Level 3.1 from Level 1 or Opioid Treatment Program (OTP)

Returning to Level 1 or OTP?

"Yes"->Leave authorization open. Do not discharge patient from Level 1 or OTP services.

"No"->Discharge patient from Level 1 or OTP services.

3a. Long term transfers to Level 3.3, 3.5 from Level 1.

Transferring from Level 1 to Level 3.3 or 3.5?

"Yes"->Discharge patient from Level 1 services.

3b. Long term transfers to Level 3.3, 3.5 from Opioid Treatment Program (OTP).

Still providing Opioid Maintenance dosing while receiving Residential services?

"Yes"->Do not Discharge patient from OTP program providing methadone or buprenorphine.

"No"->Discharge patient from OTP services.

Patients leaving against medical advice, failing to return for service, Level 1, and OTP.

An authorization may be kept open for **no more than <u>90</u>** days. If patient does not return to service, patient should be discharged. Date of discharge should be equal to last face-to-face contact with patient.

PATIENTS TRANSFERRING BETWEEN LEVELS 2.1, 2.5

Transfer from Level 2.1 to Level 2.5 from same Provider? "Yes"-> Discharge patient from Level 2.1.

Transfer from Level 2.1 to Level 2.5 to different Provider? "Yes"-> Discharge patient from Level 2.1.

Transfer from Level 2.5 to Level 2.1 from same Provider? "Yes"-> Discharge patient from Level 2.5.

Transfer from Level 2.5 to Level 2.1 to different Provider? "Yes"-> Discharge patient from Level 2.5.

B. PATIENTS IN TREATMENT IN LEVELS 3.1, 3.3, 3.5

Residential services at Level 3.1, 3.3, or 3.5 require admission and discharge at each level of care and/or data updated every 6 months if patient's length of stay exceeds 6 months.

C. PATIENTS IN TREATMENT INLEVELS 3.7, 3.7 WM

Patient transferring from a Level 3.7 WM bed to a 3.7 bed with the same Provider?

"No"-> No need to discharge patient from 3.7 WM.

Patient leaving Level 3.7 bed?

"Yes"-> Discharge patient from Level 3.7.

Patient leaving Level 3.7 WM bed and not transferring to 3.7 bed with the same Provider?

"Yes"-> Discharge patient from Level 3.7 WM.

Patients Leaving Against Medical Advice from Levels 2.1, 2.5, 3.1, 3.3, 3.5, 3.7, and Ambulatory Detox.

Patient should be discharged as soon as the Provider is aware that the patient will not be returning to services, but **no later than 30** days after the last face-to-face contact. Date of discharge should be equal to last face-to-face contact with patient.
