The CMS will hold a Special Open Door Forum (ODF) to discuss the Medicaid Integrity Program (MIP) Provider Audit Program. The primary audience for this ODF is provider groups.

Section 1936 of the Social Security Act required CMS to enter into contracts to perform four key Medicaid program integrity activities:

- 1. Review of provider actions to determine whether fraud, waste or abuse occurred or may have occurred;
- 2. Audit provider claims;
- 3. Identify overpayments;
- 4. Educate providers and others

In July 2009, CMS held the first ODF on this topic to discuss the implementation of the MIP Provider Audit Program. CMS staff discussed the MIP audit process; audit timelines, web site information and future meetings.

This special ODF is intended to provide feedback and lessons learned from the initial 18 months of the Medicaid audit program and discuss opportunities for improvement.

SEPTEMBER

September 10 and 24*, October 8* and 22*, November 5* and 19*, December 3*, January 7* and 21*, and February 4. (Dates with asterisks (*) are half days)

Treating the Addicted Patient with Co-occurring Disorders Practicum - *Peter Cohen, MD, Medical Director, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration, Baltimore, MD. Tony Swetz, PhD., Psychologist, Springfield Hospital Center, Sykesville, MD. - 48 Hours*

This is a highly experiential and practice focused course that is designed to assist the practitioner in applying the clinical knowledge and skills acquired in prior OETAS or equivalent co-occurring courses. It is case-focused with participants reviewing taped sessions of their dually diagnosed patients to enhance the learning experience. It is designed to facilitate the development of a higher level of expertise in working with the co-occurring population.

Prerequisite: You must have completed at least 80 hours of co-occurring graded courses that are equivalent to OETAS courses. You also must currently be working with dually-diagnosed patients. Access to audio/visual equipment is necessary in order to tape your patient counseling sessions. Permission from your program and patient must be obtained. Please include this information with your application. Those who successfully complete all requirements of the course will earn a Co-occurring Specialty Training Certificate.

September 27 - 29

Introduction to Addiction - *Greg Hunter, MCP, MS, LCSW-C, CISD, Therapist and Trainer in Private Practice, Baltimore, MD - 20 Hours*

This course addresses the fundamental concepts and issues necessary to gain a basic understanding of addictions. Areas of focus include models of addiction, definition of chemical dependency, the DSM IV diagnostic criteria for Substance Use Disorders, modalities of treatment, treatment practices, and clinical issues involved in treating the addicted population such as denial and defenses, stages of recovery, relapse and relapse prevention counseling, shame and guilt, co-occurring disorders, effects on the family, intervention and 12 Step groups. The knowledge, skills and abilities required to be an effective addictions counselor and a code of ethics for the addictions professional will be introduced.

OCTOBER

October 8, 15, 22 and November 19

The Addicted Patient with Depression - Jeff Gary, PhD, Clinical Director, First Step, Baltimore, MD - 27 Hours

Substance abusing patients frequently indicate that they are experiencing depression, both during active substance use and in various stages of recovery. While the assumption has traditionally been that the depression is directly related to the substance history, this is not always the case. This course is designed to help the addictions practitioner understand the causes of depression, and how to help the patient who is experiencing depression. Other mood disorders will also be discussed. Topics include signs and symptoms of mood disorders, drug related, exogenous, and endogenous depression, medications, assessment, and interventions.

Prerequisites: introductory addictions, pharmacology, counseling skills and screening courses Applies toward Co-occurring Disorders Specialty Certificate and the State of Maryland position of Alcohol and Drug Counselor, Advanced.

October 27-29

Grant Writing and Budget Management - Arnold Ross, CPA, Chief of Administration, Baltimore Substance Abuse Systems, Inc., Baltimore, MD - 20 Hours

This course will help participants learn both the processes and the technical skills involved in creating grant narratives and budgets. Participants will practice the skills required to describe services within a jurisdiction, detail relevant program policies and practices, consider environmental factors, and identify jurisdiction planning, with an emphasis on writing in a concise yet comprehensive style. The skills necessary to develop a program budget, including estimating costs and developing calculation formulas will be addressed.

Applies towards the specialized training requirements for the State of Maryland's position classification of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor, Supervisor.

NOVEMBER

November 3, 10 and 17

Anger Management - Mark Segal, LCSW-C, Director, Co-Occurring Disorders Program, Crownsville, MD - 20 Hours

The addicted patient's difficulty in managing anger responsibly and effectively is a common problem. Inappropriate responses to anger can range from complete repression or silent brooding to verbal abusiveness or impulsive aggressive behavior. Learning to manage anger effectively is a critical coping skill, central to successful recovery from addictive illness. This course will help participants identify anger related problems in their patients, understand the physiology of anger, gain insight into the effects of Axis I and II disorders on the causes and treatment of anger-related problems, and learn about medication and cognitive treatments for anger management problems with both addicted patients and patients with co-occurring disorders.

November 15-17

Treatment Planning Electronically in SMART - Dave Ennis, MS, Western Region Service Manager, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration, Baltimore, MD, Mari Howard, Smart Trainer, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration, Baltimore, MD and Kathleen Lester, MS, Director of Training Institute, Institute for Governmental Service & Research, College Park, MD - 20 Hours

This class will examine the essentials of developing a patient centered treatment plan electronically through the process of reviewing an assessment to identify problem areas, creating appropriate treatment plan goals, objectives and interventions, as well as planned services for each individual patient. Participants will learn to electronically track patient progress and use the ASAM criteria to determine continuation of treatment and at what level of care, referral or discharge from treatment. Participants will become fluent in the use of the SMART application to facilitate the patient's movement through the treatment experience.

Prerequisite: Participants must be using the SMART application in their agency.

November 16, 23 and 30

Using Motivational Interviewing with Adolescent Populations - Shannon C. Bowles, NCC, LCPC, LCADC, Regional Coordinator, Addictions Services - Central, Department of Juvenile Services, Baltimore, MD - 20 Hours

This course is designed as an advanced Motivational Interviewing course, focusing on the application of MI with challenging adolescent populations. This is an opportunity to practice and apply the principles of MI with younger patients examine how traditional addictions counseling approaches are perceived by today's youth, and understand how to apply current research to the treatment of adolescents. Participants should be knowledgeable about motivational interviewing and adolescents treatment.

November 19, December 10, January 14, February 11, March 11, April 8, May 13, June 10, July 8 and August 10

Clinical Supervision - Tom Durham, PhD, Executive Director, Danya Institute, Inc., Silver Spring, MD - 60 Hours

This 10 day workshop is a 20 module course that will begin by exploring the roles and tasks of the clinical supervisor. The workshop will be scheduled one day a month for 10 months, with each day consisting of didactic and clinical components. The workshop will look at the didactic aspect of clinical supervision including adult learning theory and how to foster an effective learning environment. Included will be the significance of the supervisory alliance, its impact on growth and change, and the role mentoring plays in a counselor's professional growth. Also explored are various models of supervision as well as the methods and processes that focus on individualized needs. Other topics include ethical aspects of supervision, evalu-

ation of counselors, and contextual factors in supervision such as cultural competency in both supervision and counseling. Highlighted will be effective leadership skills and the use of research based techniques such as "live supervision" in developing counselor self-efficacy.

Applies towards the specialized training requirements for the State of Maryland's position classification of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor, Supervisor.

DECEMBER

December 8 and 9

Trauma, Addiction, Mental Health and Recovery (T.A.M.A.R.) - Darren J. McGregor, M.S., M.H.S., L.C.M.F.T, Director, Jail-based Mental Health and Trauma Programs, Mental Hygiene Administration, Baltimore, MD, Elisza Fisher, LCPC, Frederick County Adult Detention Center, Frederick, MD, Katie O'Neil, LCSW-C, Washington County Health Department, Division of Addictions and Mental Health Services, Hagerstown, MD, Alisha Saulsbury, LCSW-C, Outpatient Psychotherapist/Trauma Specialist, TAMAR Program, Baltimore, MD - 12 Hours

This workshop is for clinicians working with individuals whose traumatic experiences have contributed to mental illness and addiction to illicit substance use. Participants will learn about Maryland's approach to understanding trauma through lecture and group participation using the TAMAR Manual and screening tools, the importance of case planning, and the challenges of connecting with the consumer after he or she leaves a residential facility. In addition to direct service strategies, participants will discuss the importance of the staff wide need to be trauma informed, be introduced to the neuro-biologic changes in the brain due to adverse experiences, and be invited to complete and discuss the Professional Quality of Life Scale and develop strategies to alleviate compassion fatigue. A presentation of the documentary "Healing Neen" will be included.

December 15-17

The Cost of Caring: Compassion Fatigue - Anna Agnew, LCSW-C, Private Practice and Training Consultant, Adjunct faculty at Harford Community College, Bel Air, MD - 20 Hours

Working with people in pain extracts a significant cost from the caregiver. Emotional exhaustion, depersonalization, reduced personal accomplishment are the chronic effects that counselors suffer as a result of interactions with patients and the demands of the workplace. Counselors are especially vulnerable to burn out due to personal isolation and ambiguous success. It is psychologically debilitating to the counselors and can impair their capacity to deliver effective care. This course will explore the symptoms of compassion fatigue, explore methods to combat compassionate fatigue and develop a well plan to address it.

JANUARY

January 12-14, 2011

Ethics and Addiction Professionals - Charles Murphy, MA, LCADC, Clinical Director, Prince George County Health Department, Clinton MD and Consultant, Baltimore, MD - 20 Hours

This course focuses on issues related to laws, rules and professional codes of ethics that govern the conduct of practitioners in the addiction field. Treatment and prevention professionals will focus on the specific characteristics of being an ethical practitioner in each area. Key areas of exploration will include ethical issues in the helping professions, boundary issues, confidentiality, patient and counselor rights, and professional relationships. Exploration of actual and potential ethical issues inherent in the addiction field will be conducted using an ethical decision-making model. Case studies will be heavily utilized.

This course fulfills the ethics workshop requirements for the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Trainee as well as the continuing education requirements used to meet the recertification requirements for drug and alcohol counselors. It cannot be used to meet the certification requirements for the CAC-AD or CSC-AD levels of certification.



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


